**Plan for the day: weeding & planting**



**Purpose:** This four year project, started in 2010, aims to restore about 4000ft of riparian habitat in upper He'eia Stream. In addition to reforesting with native vegetation, the project includes installation of erosion control techniques to address eroding stream banks, and monitoring water quality pre and post project implementation and educational workshops. Volunteers will help by clearing areas of non-native species and debris, spreading mulch, planting native species and maintaining planted areas. In the future, community groups will be able to utilize this project as an educational experience.

**What to Bring:** Refillable water bottle, snacks, sunscreen, gloves, insect repellent, shoes/boots/tabs, change of clothes, towel, good energy, and a smile :)
